10. Matthew 7:13-14

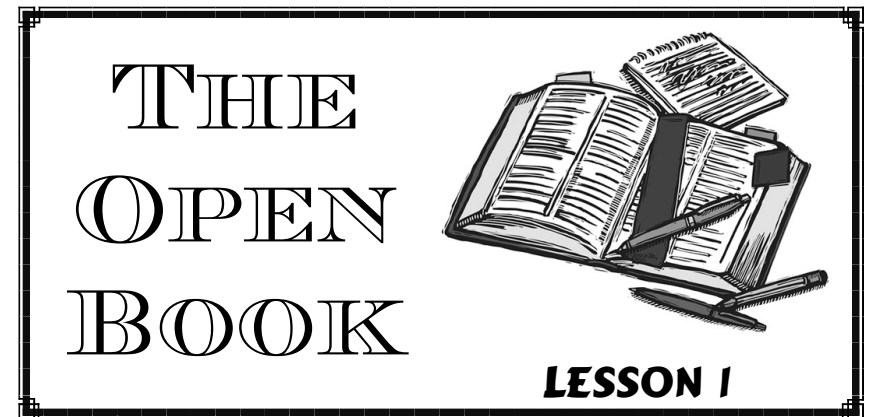
- YES NO According to Jesus, are most people traveling on the narrow road that leads to life?

- YES NO Does Jesus say that we can get into heaven on the basis of religious claims?
- YES NO Is it possible to perform deeds in the name of Christ, even with great sincerity, yet still be eternally lost?

12. Matthew 28:18-20

2. Ephesians 2:13-16

YES **NO** Does Paul teach that God has abolished the “law of commandments” (10 commandments)?

YES **NO** Does he tell us that these “ordinances” were taken out of way when Jesus died on the cross?

3. Hebrews 8:6-7

YES **NO** Does the writer say that Jesus mediates a better covenant based on better promises?

YES **NO** If the first covenant (the Law of Moses) had been faultless (perfect or complete), would there have been any need for a second?

YES **NO** Should we still strive to follow the first covenant (Law of Moses), since it has been replaced by a second covenant?

4. 2 Timothy 3:16-17

YES **NO** Are the Scriptures all that is necessary to spiritually equip someone who is seeking to do the will of God?

YES **NO** Do you believe that we are bound by or subject to that body of teaching we know as the New Testament?

5. 2 Timothy 2:15

YES **NO** It is important for us to be accurate in our handling of God’s word?

6. Acts 17:11

YES **NO** Were the Bereans called noble-minded because they took everything Paul said to be true?

YES **NO** Will God be pleased if our approach to the teaching of His word is the same as that of the Bereans?

7. John 9:1-7

YES **NO** In order to be healed, was it important for the blind man to do just as Jesus had instructed Him?

YES **NO** Would the blind man have been healed if he had refused to wash or if he had chosen to wash in some other pool?

13. Matthew 16:15-17

- YES NO Will Jesus be pleased if you and I make a similar confession today?

14. Mark 16:15-16

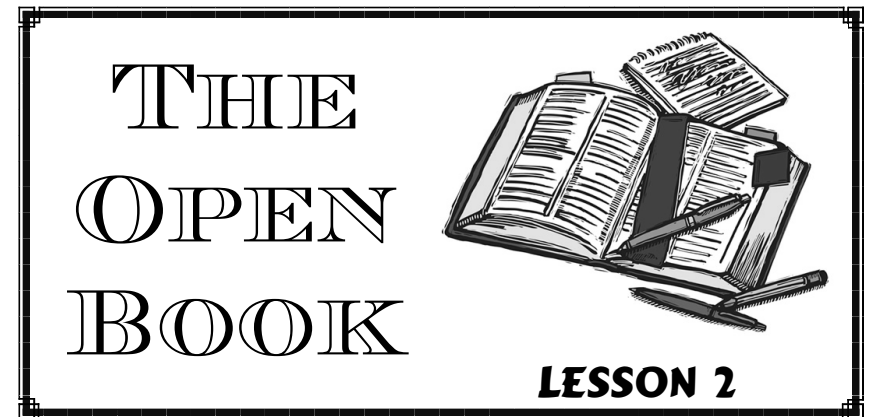
- YES NO Does Jesus promise salvation to those who believe and are baptized?
- YES NO Is baptism more essential or necessary for salvation than faith, repentance, or confession?

15. Acts 2:37-47

- YES NO Did Peter tell his listeners that their baptism would be "for" the forgiveness of their sins?
- YES NO Did those to whom Peter was speaking obey his instructions?
- YES NO Was God the one responsible for adding those who were being saved to a group of others who had previously obeyed?

16. Acts 8:35-39

- YES NO Following Philip's preaching Jesus, did the eunuch desire to be baptized in water?
- YES NO Did the eunuch's baptism require that both he and Philip go down into the water, as well as come up out of it?



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1. James 2:10

- YES NO In our efforts to do all the will of God, does just a single sin cause us to be guilty of the whole law?

2. Romans 3:23, 6:23

- YES NO Have all of us sinned and fallen short of God's glory?
- YES NO Since we are sinners, do we all deserve spiritual death?

3. 2 Corinthians 5:21

- YES NO Is it the sinless life of Jesus, who substituted Himself on our behalf, that enables us to be viewed as righteous in God's sight?

4. I Timothy 2:3-6

- YES** **NO** Does it matter to God whether we are saved or not?
- YES** **NO** Does Paul reveal that there is more than one mediator who can stand between us and God?

5. Ephesians 2:8-10

- YES** **NO** Because we could never earn our own salvation before a holy God (since that would require our sinless perfection), is the only way for us to be saved through God's gracious gift?
- YES** **NO** Though we are saved by grace, do our own "good works" play a role in our spiritual walk with God?

6. Hebrews 5:8-9; James 2:26

- YES** **NO** Though we are saved by God's grace, do we have a responsibility to obey His commands?
- YES** **NO** Must our faith be combined with works (obedience) in order for that faith to be considered "alive"?

7. John 3:16; John 8:24

- YES** **NO** If we are hoping to gain eternal life, is it essential that we believe in Jesus?
- YES** **NO** If we refuse to believe in Him, will it be possible for us to enter heaven?

8. John 14:15; Matthew 22:37-38

- YES** **NO** If we love Christ, will we seek to obey Him?
- YES** **NO** Does God require us to believe in Him and His Son, and to love them both as well?

9. Luke 13:3

- YES** **NO** In addition to God's commands that we believe and love Him, does He also require us to repent?
- YES** **NO** Is there any hope of salvation for those who refuse to repent?

10. 2 Corinthians 7:10; Acts 26:19-20

- YES** **NO** Since there is a sorrow that "produces death," does God expect more from us than just being sorry we have done wrong?
- YES** **NO** Does genuine repentance result in changes in our life?

11. Matthew 10:32-33

- YES** **NO** Is a confession or acknowledgement of Jesus essential to our going to heaven?
- YES** **NO** Of the divine commands to believe, love, repent, and confess, is any one of these commands more essential to salvation than the others?

12. Romans 10:9-10

- YES** **NO** Does God require us to do more than just believe in the existence of Jesus?
- YES** **NO** Is confessing Christ as Lord something we must do if we hope to be saved?

12. Acts 11:26

- YES** **NO** Were the followers of Jesus at Antioch simply called “Christians”?

13. Matthew 26:26-29

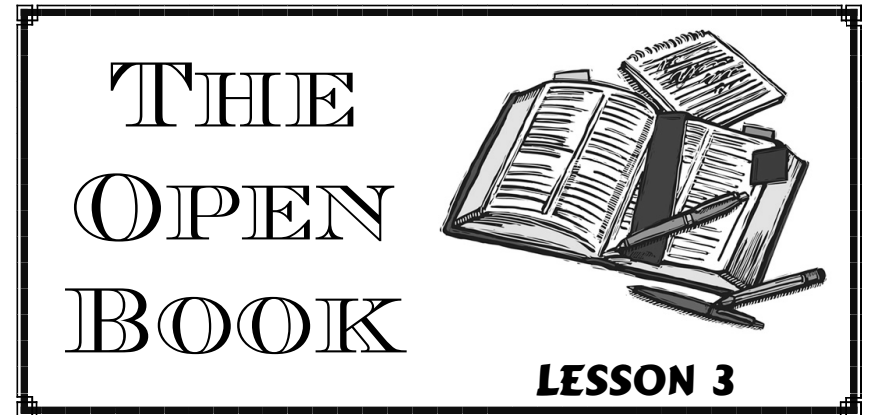
- YES** **NO** Did Jesus ask His followers to partake of both the “bread” and the “fruit of the vine” in the Lord’s supper?
- YES** **NO** Did Jesus say the bread was to represent His body and the fruit of the vine to represent His blood?

14. Acts 20:7

- YES** **NO** Do we find the 1st century Christians gathering to “break bread” (partake of the Lord’s supper) on the first day of the week?
- YES** **NO** Since the Scriptures only tell us of Christians partaking of the Lord’s Supper on the first day of the week, should we partake of it on any other day?

15. I Corinthians 16:1-2

- YES** **NO** Were the Christians in Corinth instructed to make a collection of funds on the same day of the week as those in Troas observed the Lord’s supper in Acts 20:7?
- YES** **NO** Did Paul require these Christians to give a certain amount or contribute a specific percentage of their income?



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1. Acts 19:1-5

- YES** **NO** Even though these men had already been baptized in the past, did Paul believe they needed to be baptized again?
- YES** **NO** Does this show us that there are types of baptism which are not acceptable to God?

2. Ephesians 4:4-5

- YES** **NO** Does Paul state that there is more than one baptism acceptable to God?
- YES** **NO** Based on your answer to the previous question, was Paul baptized in the same manner as the eunuch in Acts 8:35-39?

3. Romans 6:3-4

- YES** **NO** Since baptism is described as a burial, is there any question that the baptism described in Scripture required immersion in water?

3. Romans 6:3-4 (con't)

YES NO If we are baptized with the same baptism as both the eunuch and Paul, will we also be doing the will of God?

4. Romans 8:1; Galatians 3:27

YES NO Is there any condemnation for those who are "in" Christ Jesus?

YES NO Does the apostle tell us that baptism is the means by which we are clothed with Christ or placed "into" Christ?

5. Colossians 3:17

YES NO Is it God's will that we do only some things in the name of the Lord Jesus?

6. John 17:20-21

YES NO Was it the prayer of Jesus that His followers all be "one"?

YES NO Is "oneness" among Christians a necessary part of showing the world the validity of Jesus and His mission?

7. I Corinthians 1:10-13

YES NO Did Paul approve of the Corinthians' attempt to divide the church, Christ's body, into parts by choosing to follow different people?

YES NO If one group believes people are saved by faith alone and another group believes people must repent, confess, and be baptized to be saved, should both groups compromise in order to bring about unity?

8. Matthew 16:18

YES NO Did Jesus promise His followers that He would build numerous churches?

YES NO Since the church belongs to Jesus, would you expect its name to honor its builder?

9. Ephesians 1:22-23; 4:4

YES NO Does Paul tell us that the terms "body of Christ" and "church of Christ" both refer to the same group of people?

YES NO Is there more than one "body" (or church) of people who belong to Jesus?

10. Acts 2:47

YES NO Are men the ones who add new Christians to the body of saved people?

YES NO Since God is the one who adds souls to the saved, will anyone be excluded who should be included, or anyone included who should be excluded?

11. Romans 16:16

YES NO Does this passage teach that while there is only one universal body of people who are saved, there can be more than one local church?

YES NO Among the names for the body, could the name "church of Christ" be used to biblically describe those who have chosen to follow Jesus?

12. Acts 16:33,25

YES NO Did these events occur in the most favorable of circumstances or during the most convenient time of the day?

YES NO Did the jailer and his family wait to obey the Lord because of the difficult circumstances?

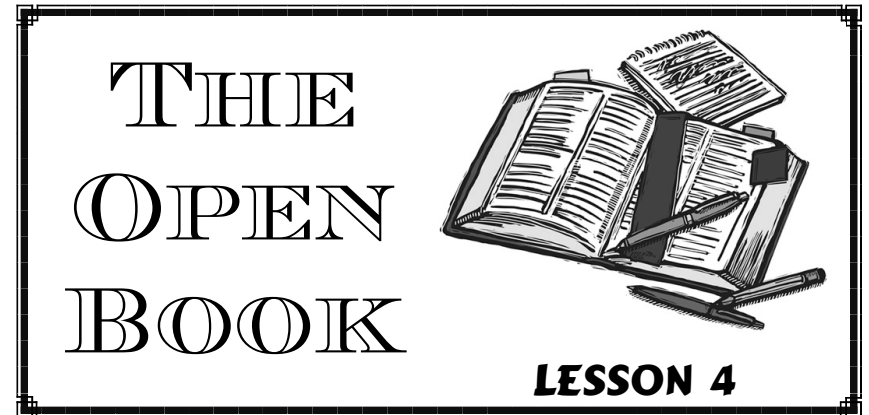
13. James 4:13-17

YES NO Since our lives are “just vapors,” does it make sense to delay doing the right thing, especially when it involves the condition of our souls before God?

YES NO Can we be right with God by knowing the Lord’s will and yet not doing it?

14. 2 Corinthians 6:2

When is the “acceptable time” to obey the will of God?



BE SURE TO READ EACH PASSAGE CAREFULLY. THEN CHECK THE CORRECT ANSWER TO EACH QUESTION.

1. Hebrews 10:24-25

YES NO Is it God’s will for saints to be absent from the assembling together of the congregation?

YES NO Is it clear from this text that when Christians are gathered together we are to be active participants rather than just uninvolved spectators?

YES NO Is worship an activity that each of us is responsible to do, rather than a “performance” we are to observe?

2. Acts 2:42

YES NO Were the early saints casual and uncommitted in their relationship to God and to one another?

YES NO Must we be similarly dedicated to Bible study and prayer if we are to grow spiritually?

3. Ephesians 5:19; Colossians 3:16

- YES NO Does the New Testament teach that we are to sing and make melody with our hearts to the Lord?
- YES NO Does either of these passages mention anything in regard to an instrument of music other than our voices and our hearts?
- YES NO Does Paul tell us that our singing is for the purposes of teaching, admonishing, and speaking to one another?
- YES NO Can a mechanical instrument of music accomplish any of these purposes?

4. Revelation 22:18-19; I Corinthians 4:6

- YES NO Is God pleased when we add elements to or remove them from the instruction He has given to us?
- YES NO Since the New Testament gives us no instructions or examples of early Christians using mechanical instruments in worship, would we be adding something to His word by using a piano, organ, or other musical instrument?

5. 2 John 9

- YES NO Does it matter to God if we go beyond the teaching we find in His word?

6. Galatians 1:8-9

- YES NO If someone preaches a gospel other than what we read in the New Testament, will that person be accursed (condemned)?

- YES NO Since the destiny of our souls depends on the instruction we choose to follow, would you want someone to preach to you anything other than what can be found in the New Testament?

7. Romans 12:1-2

- YES NO Because of the many “mercies” God has extended to us, would the appropriate response be to offer ourselves up as “living sacrifices?”
- YES NO Might this require greater sacrifice from some than it does from others?

8. Titus 2:12-14

- YES NO Though we are saved by the grace of God, are we free to live however we want?

9. Hebrews 12:14

- YES NO If we refuse to pursue a life of holiness (sanctification), can we still expect to receive the Lord’s approval?

10. John 14:15

- YES NO Is our obedience to Christ a demonstration of our love for Him?
- YES NO If we refuse to obey His word, can we honestly say that we love Him?

11. Acts 22:16

- YES NO Was Paul told he could wait until a later time to obey the Lord’s instruction that had come to him through Ananias?
